Year 2/3:

What another brilliant week we have had in Year 2/3! On Monday it was a tornado day with Mrs Jones! The class learnt all about tornados and how they occur. They then created pieces of art work inspired by tornados. They also created an experiment to see how tornadoes work. On Tuesday it was our beach trip to Filey! The children were incredibly well behaved and had a fantastic time exploring the beach. They were identifying rocks, finding clay, building different sculptures and taking part in lots of games such as volleyball and football. For the rest of the week, in Maths, the children have been learning about mass, volume and capacity. The children have learnt how to measure both them practically in active Maths lessons. In English the children wrote recounts of our school trip. They were encouraged to describe in detail their favourite parts of the trip and what made them so exciting. In Art, the class created pieces that were inspired by the seaside to link to our trip. Finally in P.E., the children were practising their athletics skills in anticipation of our Sports Day on Thursday. The class all conducted themselves brilliantly and it was fantastic to see them take part in the races!

In Maths this week the class learned how to distinguish between different quadrilaterals and sort them using given properties. They learned how to describe position on a grid using coordinates and how to plot coordinates.

In Science this week the class learned all about life cycles of mammals, and described the different stages. In History they recapped learning about Henry VIII and had a go at their own portraits of Henry VIII using the grid method!

The children had a fantastic time on Filey beach on Tuesday. Many of them went rock pooling and had great fun playing sports on the beach!
