Somehow we find ourselves here at the start of what will quickly become 'the Christmas half term', where has the year gone?

Reception and Year 1 Class News:

The children have come back to school with so much enthusiasm this week, keen to share their stories from Halloween and other experiences from the holidays! This moved us into thinking about the upcoming Bonfire Night and why it is celebrated. We explored the history of Bonfire Night and the story of the Gunpowder Plot! Year 1 have made Guy Fawkes 'wanted' posters and written in the role of characters from the story. We talked about how to keep safe with fireworks and the children have made firework safety videos. We watched a firework display on the whiteboard and have produced some firework art! The children have also built a bonfire in the outdoor area (and are constantly checking there are no hedgehogs inside!!)

In phonics, Reception have introduced t, i, n, p to their letter sound repertoire and we have been practising blending words with these sounds in. Year 1 have been working on their group reading books, practising the story red and green words.

In maths, Year 1 have been consolidating their understanding of part/whole models and have used them to make 'fact families'. We spent a couple of lessons on this and they grasped it really well by the end! We have introduced the concept of 'one more' and 'one less' with numbers 1, 2 and 3, using a number track. Then the children investigated circles, thinking about the properties and making some circle art!

In other areas of our classroom, there has been potion making, spooky stencils, pen disco, firework dancing, building the Houses of Parliament in construction, leaf clearing for our compost bin in the outdoor area and lots more!!

Year 2 and 3 Class News.

What a fantastic return to school it has been for Year 2/3. The class have hit the ground running with their learning and have not stopped! In Maths this week, the class have continued to learn about addition and subtraction and have focused on using bar models to support them solving word problems. In English, the class have learnt about shape poems and written their own all about Bonfire night. In History, the class have wrapped up their learning about Captain Cook with a fact file all about his life and voyages. In Science, we have started a new topic about Forces and magnets and so the class had time exploring what magnets are and seeing what objects they were attracted to. In P.E., the class also started learning how to dribble in basketball.

Year 4 and 5 Class News:

It was lovely to welcome the class back after half-term and they have worked their socks off this week! On Monday we used our summarising skills to record key points from our research on Anglo Saxon Settlements and homes. We took care to only include the main points and organise our points into a bulleted list. On Tuesday we began to identify the features of biographies and autobiographies in preparation for our next English unit. We read an extract from Boy by Roald Dahl and an informative text about the author. Later in the week we had an exciting couple of sessions exploring the idea of an 'inspirational person', using a biography of Nelson Mandela as a focus. This will inspire our writing across the next couple of weeks.

In Maths we have been working very hard on improving our rapid recall of times tables and started the week by looking at what happens when we multiply by 0, 1 and divide a number by 1 and itself. We made generalisations about what happens and applied these to reasoning challenges. We then moved on to multiply by 10, 100 and 1000.

In Art we have been using our drawing skills to record ideas of what an Anglo-Saxon house looks like. We focused on the shape of the building, the texture of the roof and how we could add "personality" to our sketches by interpreting the subject rather than just copying as we had done in our still life work last half term. In Music the children continued to practise different strings playing 'House of Doom' and other spooky songs. They even started to learn how to play chords!

In French the class have learned vocabulary for different members of the Simpsons family and practised spelling. The class had an excellent day on Wednesday for 'Forest School'. They made lots of different outdoor crafts, tried out rope swings and even relaxed on a hammock!
