A message from the Head:

It has been a real delight to welcome pupils back into school this week and fill the building with the life it has very much been missing since December. The children have all coped incredibly well with the return to routine and smiles and laughter have been abound.

Thank you to all of our families for maintaining the start and end of day routines and ensuring we stay as 'COVID safe' as possible throughout. As you know things are not quite 'business as usual' in school but we are trying to look ahead and plan for some familiar events to still take place;

- Standard end of term class assessments will still take place in the final week and we will inform you of the outcomes of these after the Easter holiday.
- Home / School Conference Evenings, which would typically take place around now, will still occur but we
 will push these back until May so have a little more insight into how pupils are coping post return. It is
 likely that these will once again be via Zoom.
- End of year written reports will still be issued in July.
- We are led to believe that risk assessments will be revised come the Summer Term to allow off site visits. If
 this occurs we will look to offer Year 6 access to swimming lessons and all pupils the opportunity for a day
 trip off site.
- We are currently told there are no firm plans to reinstate residential visits this academic year, however that is not to say that this will not change. Furthermore we are told that the future of North Yorkshires outdoor education sites (of which Bewerley Park is one) very much 'hangs in the balance'. For now our residential visit remains in the diary and we will share any further updates on this with you when we have them.

As ever, we will let you know of any changes to routine or diary dates with as much notice as possible and we thank you in advance for your ongoing support with the challenges this current context continues to present. Our Reception and Year 1 children have had a fantastic week! Year 2 and 3 Class News:

What a brilliant first week back at school! Every child has come back with a can do attitude and worked incredibly hard. In class, the children have been eased back into their learning. In Maths, the children have continued to learn about shape and their properties. In English, the children have been looking at diary entries and how to express characters feelings. In the afternoons, we have been celebrating National Science Week! We have focused on the children's practical enquiry skills, looking at different types of investigations, key vocabulary and how to write up different elements of an experiment i.e. predications, methods and conclusions. The children have had their first dance session with our PE coaches from First Steps on Friday and they seemed to have thoroughly enjoyed it. Year 4 and 5 Class News:

It's been so good to have year 4 / 5 back this week. They have all settled in so well and have hit the ground running with their learning. We have carried out lots of group tasks this week to get the children working as a team and co-operating with each other. In maths we have recapped on equivalent fractions, multiplication, division and comparing fractions. In English we have continued with the non-chronological reports the children began at home during their remote learning. This week we have completed our tiger reports and began to plan a large factual poster. This week we have celebrated British Science week by carrying out an invertebrate hunt in the school outdoor education area. Building on their work on invertebrates, the children also had great fun inventing their own 'robo-bug' on Friday designed to achieve goals such as search and rescue or construction. On Thursday the children started their music lessons with Mrs Moulds playing the ukulele! They did amazing! PE days are Wednesdays and Fridays. All children now have a home / school reading book. The target is for them to read this at home at least three times a week.

Year 6 Class News:

It has been lovely to be back at school with our friends and teachers. It is definitely much easier at school than at home. In learning for life this week we have been learning what stereotypes are and how people might be affected by negative stereotypes. At the end of the lesson we had to work in groups to rewrite comments so they didn't promote stereotypical thinking. In Science we have started our new topic living things and their habitats. For our first lesson were working as taxonomists to classify animals based on their similarities and these are on Seesaw. In English we have been exploring and discussing a poem called 'Windrush Child' by John Agard. Then, we used preposition phrases to generate ideas for our poem and then we have been drafting our poem. In maths we have been recapping the 4 methods with fractions and solving lots of reasoning challenges.
