Reception and Year 1 Class News:

Reception and Year 1 have had another very seasonal week this week and it was lovely to see so many of you enjoying our classroom on Wednesday evening!

Fireworks have continued to be a major theme in discussions and activities following bonfire night at the weekend! We followed on from our 'Zim Zam Zoom' poem with a focus on onomatopoeia and firework sound words! Year 1 went on to write their own firework poem which we will share soon! We have explored different ways of making firework art too! At the end of the week, we started to talk about why the children are seeing poppies around, and introduced the idea of 'peace' and what it means to us. There were lots of lovely descriptions and ideas. We went on a leaf hunt and found some orangey-red leaves, then we used our cutting skills to snip them up and stuck them on Poppy templates to make our own natural poppies! In phonics, Reception have covered the letters r, j and v. Year 1 have covered /ar/ (start the car), /air/ (that's not fair) and /ou/ (shout it out). They have also been having a go at 'proof reading' their work and others'. In maths, Reception have been exploring 3 and 4, practising their subitising skills. Reception's first week of Doodlemaths at home has been a brilliant one! Thank you for all your support with this! Year 1 have been looking at different way of comparing amounts and we introduced fact families, following on from our part/whole model work.

We have started to rehearse the nativity songs this week and the children are picking them up quickly! You might hear the odd hum around the house and, before long, you'll get full blown song performances, I'm sure! Costume requests will be sent out next week!

Year 2 and 3 Class News.

The children have enjoyed learning about Remembrance Day this week in our assemblies, understanding the symbolism of the poppies we've been buying as part of the British Legion fundraiser in school. This culminated in a 2 minute silence at 11am today, whilst we watched footage from war memorials around the country. We also read an online story book called 'Lest We Forget' and this afternoon we enjoyed creating some poppy field paintings using a variety of printing techniques.

At the start of the week we were excited to have another fun and competitive PE session with Mr Taylor. This definitely wakes us up on a dreary, chilly Monday! In the rest of the wider curriculum we have been rehearsing the songs for our Christmas play and then became mini geologists for the week, studying rocks; how they are formed, different types and the rock cycle. Can the children tell you about Igneous, Sedimentary and Metamorphic rocks?!

We continued our poetry topic in English, learning about onomatopoeia (try spelling that first thing in the morning!) and thinking of lots of words to describe fireworks and bonfire night sights, smells and sounds. The children have worked well in small groups, creating vocabulary mind maps and sharing ideas. Now we are putting our descriptive phrases into our own firework shape poems.

In Mastering Maths we have learnt that two odd or two even numbers always total an even number, using images to help us see how. In our Maths lessons we have been adding and subtracting tens from 2 digit or 3 digit numbers.

Nativity costume requests will be sent out next week; we have managed to source the vast majority from our school collection and with support from the PTA. So the items from home will mostly be garments to wear under their costumes. Thank you for your support with this and do practise the children's lines and song words with them if you get the chance!

Next week we will be having a lesson using the NSPCC 'Pants' resources. Please check these out online and if you have any questions please let us know on Monday morning.

They learned how to use formal conjunctions and support main points with supporting points. They also worked hard to use emotive language and rhetorical questions. In Maths this week the children have learned how to find factors and common factors of numbers. They have also learned/revised their 6 and 9 times tables.

With Mrs Jones on Tuesday the class finished their anti-bullying posters as part of their Learning for Life and ready for anti-bullying week. In PE the class continued to practise their basketball skills in small games.

We had a very interesting first lesson on the Maya Civilization in History, learning about who they were and where they lived. The children had a great time using 'Google Earth' to find all the Maya city-states and the ruins they left behind.

Hello. This week in year 6 we have been learning about (BIDMAS) which stands for brackets , indices , division , multiplication , addition , subtraction. In English we have been doing expand sentences using expanded noun phrases, identifying adverbials, expanding sentences using relative clauses.
